IT IS ALL ABOUT JESUS

**A movement that changed the world
and restored the church**

Luther’s teaching, and that of the Reformation, is often summarized in three “solas.” Sola gratia, sola fide and sola scriptura — by faith alone, by grace alone and by Scripture alone. The key to Reformation theology is found in God’s love for people. By grace alone means that God gives His love freely. People can’t earn God’s love. People can’t earn forgiveness. God’s love is not

gained by human efforts, but given freely by

God’s grace. By faith alone means that those who believe in Jesus as God’s Savior for all of mankind receive forgiveness and eternal life. Faith is something God gives to people through His Holy Spirit, working in the Word of God and the Sacraments of Holy Baptism and the Lord’s Supper. People do nothing to earn God’s love, but receive it by grace through faith. By Scripture alone means that God has revealed His truth through the Holy Bible. Scripture is the one trustworthy source for the truth about God. The Scriptures are properly read in light of Jesus as the Son of God in the flesh. The Bible teaches that His death and resurrection is the key event in all of history, because there, Jesus died to gain the forgiveness of everyone’s sins. This does not mean that Christians should only read the Bible. Sola scriptura means that the Bible is the only trustworthy source for doctrine and life.

The three solas, by grace alone, by faith alone and by Scripture alone, are all summarized in one more phrase from the Reformation, solus Christus — through Christ alone. This is really the focus of the Reformation. God’s grace, our faith and the Scriptures are all focused on Jesus Christ. The Reformation moved the focus from the Church to Jesus. Luther and the reformers taught that Jesus is how God relates to us and how we relate to Him. The reformers taught that Jesus is our salvation, that Jesus is the way that God loves.

When Martin Luther understood Jesus as the center of all of Scripture and man’s relationship to God, he saw everything in light of this relationship between God and man. This moved him to teach about the Christian’s role in society, the role of the government, and how individual Christians live out their faith.

Luther cared for the people in his town and worked to provide materials for them, writing the Small Catechism to teach the basics of the faith, and translating the Bible into German so that everyone could read the Word of God.

Martin Luther posted the 95 Theses in Wittenberg, Germany, 500 years ago. Much has changed since then. Many things we encounter daily were influenced by the Reformation. The heart of the Reformation was theology. It was a return to God as the source of mankind’s salvation. It was a focus on God’s love. 500 years later, Lutherans still teach this theology, and rejoice in God’s love.



A Message from the Congregational President

The **church council** set **4 goals** for the 2017-18 year at its meeting August 24 – these are to be discussed at board and council meetings throughout the year.

- To work toward Financial Stability** -- The church council will present a balanced budget for the 2018-19 budget year.
- To connect members and increase member involvement in intentional ministry** – Each Board and Staff member will seek greater involvement of 5 new people in the intentional ministry of the work of the Boards and Committees this year.
- To evaluate our school ministry** – The church council will see that a program, by an outside group, to evaluate the School Ministry will take place as soon as possible.
- To unite the Church and School ministry and increase involvement** – The church council will seek to build closer relationships and involvement of the church and school members and ministries in the activities and programs of the church and school.

The Call Committee, as established in the by-laws, is asking the members of the congregation for names to consider for the position of principal of the school. I have been in contact with Sally Hiller from the Southeastern District requesting names of possible candidates. The committee will meet in January to begin discussion and interviews of possible candidates for the position of principal of the school. The tentative time line that I propose is: Sept. – Dec. search for candidates; Jan –March interview candidates; April special call meeting for position of principal.

The **T Mobile project** will begin in October (if not before). A delay was due to a lack of materials.

Work on the wall behind the altar has begun and will end mid-October.

The **PTL of the school** has a new executive board and they are very enthusiastic. Please watch for information about school activities, fundraisers and social activities. This is part of **council goal #4**.

Since the beginning of the 2017-18 budget year our **line of credit** has increased. Our total is now \$162,900.58. The increase is due to lower summer income from both the church and school and continued budgeted expenses. This happens each year. I firmly believe that any increases in the line of credit will be minimal from now thru most of the budget year.

The church council's next meeting is Nov. 21 at 7 PM.

We will have several **special voters meetings** during the year to address: by-law changes; elections/nominations and overtures for the Southeastern District Convention to be held in May, 2018; and the call for the school principal.

LOVING ONE ANOTHER

By the time you read this, the Voters Assembly will have acted on the recommendation of Pastor Schafer and the Board of Elders to make some 40 members of our congregation into former members. Some of them have joined other Christian congregations; others have moved out of the area and not kept in touch with anyone in the congregation. However, most of them continue to live in our community, but have simply stopped attending worship services or otherwise participating in church activities.

My question to you is: Did you notice? Did you ever wonder why the people who used to sit in the pew near you had disappeared? Do you know whether anything happened in their lives that pulled them away from the Church? Did you do anything to find out what happened to them?

I'm not writing to condemn anyone. I have been just as guilty as anyone else of failing to show sufficient concern for the physical and spiritual well-being of my fellow members. Instead I write as the newly elected Chairman of the Board of Elders to ask you to help make sure that our current members don't turn into former members without our doing everything in our power to keep them from slipping away, unnoticed or unaware of our concern and love for them.

The Elders have resolved to review attendance reports weekly and to contact members whose worship patterns undergo an unexplained change. The Elders can be more effective with your help: if you notice that a formerly faithful member stops attending regularly, please call or email him or her and ask what's going on; if you don't want to make the contact yourself, please voice your concern to Pastor Schafer or one of the Elders so that we can follow up. Our goal should be to have it said of us as was said of the early Church: "See how they love one another!"


